
Ottawa's Underutilized Immigrant Workforce

The report of the Commission on the reform of Ontario's public services – the Drummond Report – points out that "the degree to which Ontario can successfully integrate new arrivals into the province's labour market and social fabric will have a significant effect on Ontario's fiscal fortunes." Currently, however, immigrants coming to Ontario and to the city of Ottawa are experiencing much higher levels of unemployment than the Canadian-born population, even though they are more likely to have post-secondary qualifications. Immigrants are also more likely to work in jobs not commensurate with their skill levels and training.

The Conference Board of Canada puts the annual national cost of underutilizing immigrant skills between \$4.1 and \$5.9 billion.

Successful labour market integration is also an issue for immigrants settling in the city of Ottawa. According to the 2011 National Household Survey, recent immigrants to Ottawa who held a university degree had an unemployment rate of 14.8%, more than three times higher than their Canadian-born counterparts.

Quick Facts

- Among Ottawa's immigrants who arrived in Canada between 2006 and 2009, the median earning in 2010 was \$22,403, which is \$22,400 lower than the median earnings of the Canadian-born population.
- If the employment rate and average earnings of Ottawa's immigrants matched that of Ottawa's Canadian-born population, in 2010, the aggregate earnings of immigrants would have increased by \$1.1 billion equivalent to 2.3% of Ottawa-Gatineau's GDP in 2010.
- A recent report by RBC Economics puts the national earnings gap between immigrants and Canadian-born at more than \$30 billion.
- 95% of employers who have hired a skilled immigrant in the past say that hiring skilled immigrants has been beneficial to the company.
